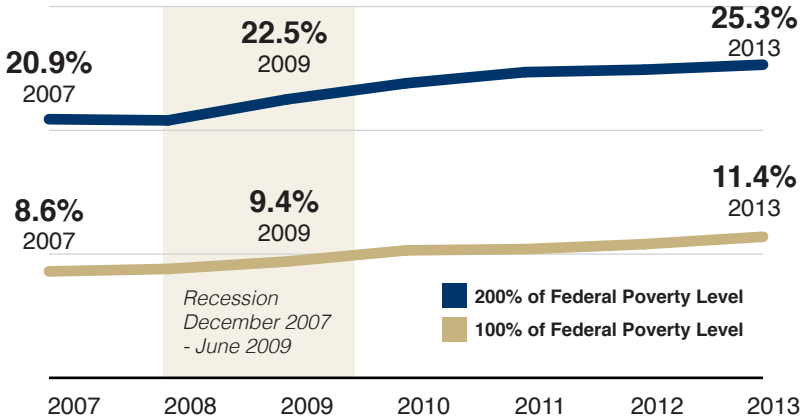

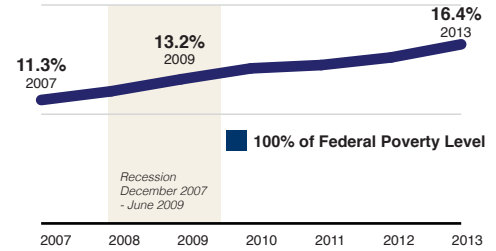

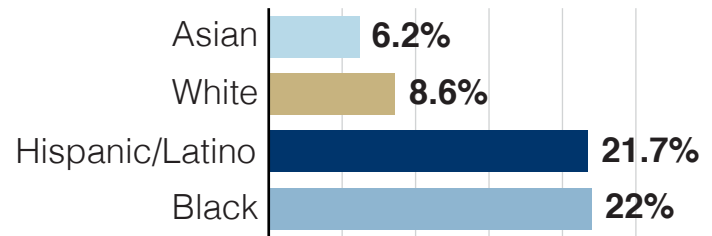
Official and Real Poverty Still Rising



Child Poverty Still Rising

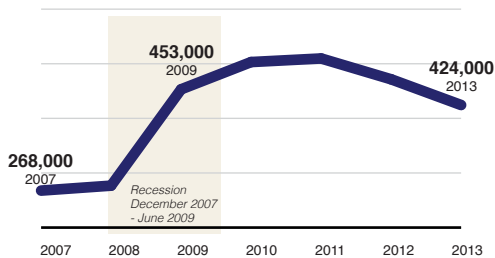


Poverty Rates Far Higher for Blacks and Hispanics

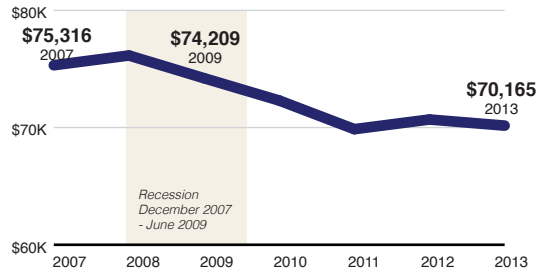


INCOMES ARE DOWN, JOBLESSNESS PERSISTS & NEW JERSEYANS REMAIN STRETCHED THIN

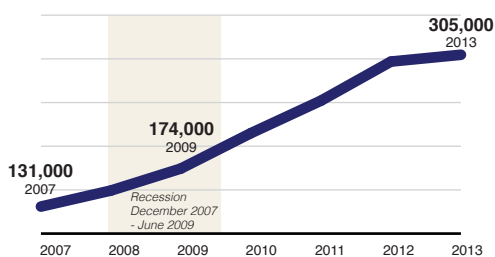
Hundreds of Thousands of Residents Remain Unemployed
