The analyst should be highly motivated, effective, and committed to advancing policy ideas that foster broadly shared prosperity and widespread opportunity. The position offers an excellent opportunity to join in a collaborative, high-growth, mission-driven organization and to help inform critical conversations that will shape the future of New Jersey's environment and public transportation systems.

Responsibilities

- Produce policy reports, blogs, and briefs on transportation and environmental issues.
- Promote effective policy recommendations that improve the lives of New Jerseyans.
- Conduct original quantitative and qualitative research.
- Testify on pending legislation in your issue areas.
- Identify new emerging transportation and environment issues that could help state residents.
- Engage with media, inform policymakers and staff, and collaborate with community-based advocates.
- Represent NJPP in advocacy coalitions.
- Present on NJPP research for diverse audiences.
- Take a proactive, leadership role on transportation and environment legislative issues at the state or federal level.

- Exceptional research skills in quantitative and qualitative analysis. Experience with Microsoft Excel and other data analysis programs as necessary.
- Commitment to economic, racial, and social justice through intersectional analyses.

- Demonstrated expertise in analyzing and estimating the fiscal impact of transportation and environment programs and services.
- Analyzes and clearly documents data to make comparisons and draw conclusions.
- Ability to think creatively about research designs as well as policy solutions.
- Identifies cause and effect relationships to solve complex problems.
- Identifies opportunities to visualize data and/or present analysis creatively to expand potential reach and impact.

Oral and Written Communications

- Excellent writing and public speaking skills with the ability to explain complex issues in everyday language.
- Prepares written documentation to transfer technical information about concepts, situations, products, services, or results to diverse audiences.
- Ability to organize, express and communicate ideas in a clear, succinct, accurate, and convincing manner through a variety of communication settings and styles.
- Ability to communicate effectively with and quickly respond to the media.

Interpersonal Communications

- Demonstrates adaptive and effective communications suitable for a wide range of audiences.
- Actively listens to seek clarification and understanding.
- Open to consider other viewpoints.
- Uses diplomacy and tact.

Priority Setting and Problem Solving

- Probes all sources for answers, looks beyond the obvious.
- Spends time on what's important.
- Quickly zeros in on critical issues and puts the trivial mainly aside.
- Eliminates roadblocks and creates focus.

- Understands the political environment of New Jersey.
- Perceives organizational and political sensitivities and acts accordingly.
- Understands different people's attitudes about power and politics and adapts personal approaches for optimal influence.

Networking/Relationship Building/Collaboration

- Works cooperatively with others, inside and outside the organization, to accomplish objectives to build and maintain partnerships, leverage information, and achieve results.
- Identifies, organizes, facilitates and /or sustains mutually beneficial partnerships and alliances with internal and external stakeholders.
- Experience in effectively working with state legislators or members of Congress on transportation and environment issues. And experience working with public and private sectors of the transportation and environment systems.
- Experience in effectively working with coalitions to support transportation and environment policies that benefit low- and middle-income individuals and families, people of color, and other groups that are systematically left behind.

Agility

- Anticipates trending issues and potential opportunities and consequences accurately.
- Juggle complex and occasionally shifting timelines.
- Works constructively with NJPP leadership and board.

Compensation

This position is full-time and based in Trenton. The salary range for the Transportation and Environment Policy Analyst is \$60,000 - \$70,000. NJPP also offers a competitive benefits package.
